John Turner - Curriculum Vitae

Overview

John is a teacher/performer/clown/director/creator. He is the Founder/Artistic Director of The Clown Farm formerly known as The Manitoulin Conservatory for Creation and Performance (MCCP), a unique facility for research, training, creation and performance in all areas of the performing arts.

Situated in the heart of glorious Manitoulin Island, Ontario, Canada, surrounded by rolling fields, gentle forests and tranquil inland lakes, the MCCP offered students that came from Ontario, across Canada, and around the globe to explore the worlds of their creativity in a unique and exquisite environment. There they found an ideal setting for training that could be applied on a personal or professional level. While the primary focus of the program was on the development and growth of the artist, the introductory levels were enjoyed by participants from all walks of life (teachers, therapists, musicians, professors, doctors, carpenters, etcetera). The aspiring or established artist also found a strong focus on the creation and/or performance of professional works.

While the global pandemic caused the closing of the doors of the Manitoulin facility John continues with the work as an internationally sought after teacher and coach in the fields of acting, mask, clown, and movement virtually as well as having returned in person in both private institutions as well as public ones.

John most recently directed Mia Star van Leeuwen's exploration workshop of her "Ghost" project, Justin Miller's "Pearle Harbour in Distant Early Warning" at Buddies in Bad Time, Toronto, and was Artistic Associate and Clunic Consultant on Karen Hines' Pochsy IV at the premier at One Yellow Rabbit's High Performance Rodeo. John was also the director on Jennifer Dallas' Kemi Projects' Dora Award winning and ground-breaking dance/clown fusion piece Kittly Bender 2017, followed by *Know* in January 2020 in Toronto. Other recent/current collaborations and directing/dramaturgy activities include work with Karen Hines, Amy Lee and Heather Annis (Morro and Jasp), Jed Tomlinson and Jacqueline Russell (Sizzle and Spark), Christine Moynihan (Ethel), Alyssa Billingsley, and of course Mump & Smoot.

He is also the Co-Artistic Director and the "Smoot" half of Mump & Smoot, the award winning clown duo that have been a hit from coast to coast for the past 36 years. With Mump & Smoot he has created and performed in 8 full length shows that have been performed in major regional theatres across North America and in the middle east. These theatres include the Astor Place Theater (Off Broadway), Yale Repertory Theater, the La Jolla Playhouse, the Dallas Theater Center, the American Repertory Theater (Boston), Baltimore Center Stage, the Canadian Stage in Toronto, Alberta Theatre Projects in Calgary, and the Vancouver East Cultural Centre to name but a few.

In his twenties he had jobs as a roughneck, nursing orderly, painter, construction worker, frying pan salesman and bartender. Richard Pochinko, Ian Wallace, and Fiona Griffiths introduced him to clown, mask and movement. He also studied bouffon with Philippe Gaulier, physical comedy with John Towsen and improv at Second City.

Mump & Smoot have won two Dora Mavor Moore Awards and two Canadian Comedy Awards and were nominated for the *Walter Carsen Prize for Excellence in Theatre*, among other industry honours. John is also currently creating a solo clown show for which he has received Canada Council and Ontario Arts Council creation grants. In the past he has also served as an Arts Grant juror for the Ontario Arts Council.
